Summer Assignment Description	Students will learn the names and geographical locations of all Spanish-speaking countries of the world, along with their respective capitals.
Date Due	Testing will occur within the first two weeks of the school year.
Estimated Time for Completion	Learning times vary, but in general, it should not take more than 2 weeks in total to learn the names of the countries, their locations, and their capitals if students study a little at a time using provided materials and directions. Equatorial Guinea does NOT need to be learned, but Spain (España) does.

Rationale for Summer Assignment	In order to more deeply and usefully learn a second language, it is important for students to learn where the language is spoken across the globe to help connect them to the real-world application of second language acquisition. Equatorial Guinea does NOT need to be learned, but Spain (España) does.
Resources needed to complete Summer assignment	Internet-capable device; blank Spanish speaking countries map (found anywhere online) to practice; YouTube for learning songs (Central America: https://youtu.be/fAupLjNTae0 South America: https://youtu.be/Nw1H8alhKNk) or completed map from the internet for studying.
<u>How</u> and <u>when</u> will <u>this</u> summer assignment be assessed and scored? Also, what grading category and what percentage will this summer assignment count in the student's grade?	Students will be tested on their geographical knowledge of the Spanish-speaking world during the first week of school via a blank map. Students will need to know the location of each country on the map AND which capital corresponds with that country. Students will not be responsible for knowing the exact location of each capital, just which one goes with which country and where that country is located. This is test grade, so it will be counted towards the 30% test category.
